SERVICES:

- **Adult Health:** *Includes Morbidity, Chronic Diseases and Geriatrics, other than Home Health. Routine blood pressure checks, pap smears, pregnancy tests, breast exams, stool cultures, and pinworm slides.*
- **Infant & Child Health:** *Well-child clinics with physician present and/or nursing conferences which includes examinations, counseling in regard to diets, growth and development, immunizations, lab tests, etc.*
- **Crippled Children Services:** *Case finding, handling referrals. Nurses assist with transportation arrangements to clinics, hospitals, etc. Follow-up including home visits to support regular clinic attendance and recommendations for treatment and rehabilitation*
- **Dental Services:** *Provides services for school children through the age of 14. The major portion of the clinic is devoted to taking care of children with toothaches and extracting teeth. Some restorative and prophylactic work is done on a limited basis.*
- **Family Planning:** *Complete physical assessment, which includes blood pressure.*
- **Home Care Services:** *Nursing Care - part time, Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, and Aide Services. Client must be under care of a physician who orders the services and provides supervision. The patient must experience physical difficulty obtaining services on an outpatient basis. Service to those without a nursing home bed available. Eligible if service is needed and if living in named counties, and also depends on home support structure.*
- **Immunizations:** *These are given on a regular basis to anyone requesting this service. DPT, Polio, Rubella, Mumps and measles are required for entering the first year of school in Georgia.*
- **Maternal Health Services:** *This clinic is to examine pregnant women and the delivery is the responsibility of the women. If there are no clinicians to meet with patients, then the nurses will hold WIC clinics for pregnant and lactating women who have a nutritional need for supplemental food. Pregnant women are encouraged to seek early prenatal care from their doctor.*

- **Public Health Education Services:** Health Education presentations are available to schools, churches and community groups upon request.
- **Tuberculosis Program:** Routine diagnosis and evaluations are done such as chest X-rays at intervals. There is follow-up care and Chemoprophylaxis program to attend.
- **Sexually Transmitted Diseases:** Provides services for all cases and previous contacts. Service Includes: Diagnosis, treatment, interviews for contacts, follow-ups, and Prophylactic treatment.
- **WIC:** Supplemental food program for women and children who are at nutritional risk. Nutrition Counseling and physical assessments are part of the program.
- **Environmental Sanitation Program:** Inspection of restaurants, nursing homes, motels, school lunchrooms and septic tanks; insect and rabies control; water source approval; complaint investigations; emergency medical services.

Provision of services is based on need regardless of day/ time.

The Service Center provides both facility-based community integrated services. The Facility-Based Program provides skill training to children and adults. Program emphasis is on prevention, early intervention and developmental programs for infants and pre-school children with emphasis on work for adult clients. Priority is given to pre-schoolers and adults as most school-aged children are being served in Special Education classes in public school. A wide range of support and professional services are also provided. Facility-based services are provided Monday through Friday, twelve months a year with daily transportation and lunches provided.

The Service Center also offers a variety of services to the area's adult mentally retarded population. Services consist of Work Activity Program. Recreation/leisure training, and training in functional living skills. Training occurs in the facility, in the client's home, and in work adjustment, skill training and vocational counseling to vocational age adults. Clients are paid for the work they produce during work activities based on the prevailing industry wage for the same type of work.

Some in-center programs include specialized rehabilitative and therapeutic services for the more profoundly disable clients with emphasis on basic self-help skills and they gain essential skills. The Community Integrated Services offered by the Service Center provides out of facility training, case management and support services. These services facilitate client transition to and maintenance in other community services that provide opportunities for social integration such as independent living situations and job placements. Service includes resource development and mobilizing of groups, resources and organizations in response to client's needs. Case management services are offered and monitored and followed up in their progress in these services.

- *SEPS participates in campaigns, such as Red Ribbon Week, that promote "Life Drug Free". We participate in community events (health fairs, awareness campaigns) by exhibiting and distributing prevention materials.*

The program is unique in that the funding comes from two grants: (1) The Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) which is operated by Private Industry Council. JTPA is an employment service of the Georgia Department of Labor. Jobs are 32 plus hours per week, and (2) Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS). This program is a Supported Employment demonstration state project. Jobs are 20 plus hours per week, consistent with the federal definition of Supported Employment. The Grant monies from these two sources were used to hire five Employment Specialist (Job Coaches) one for each Service Center. Because of the use of grant monies, the target population is adults with developmental disabilities and not just mentally retarded citizens. Pineland's objective is to place in integrated competitive employment developmentally disabled persons using the Job Coach method of supported employment. The Job Coach identifies potential jobs through extensive job development and arranges client interviews. Once an employer selects an applicant, the Job Coach goes on the job with the participant to provide a minimum training period of four weeks and a maximum of eight weeks. Follow-up support is provided by the Service Center staff, who provides training for these persons in money management Recreation/Leisure skills, etc. Work training is conducted one-on-one by the Job Coach. The ultimate purpose of Supported Employment is to achieve the highest possible economic and social self-sufficiency for these chronically unemployed persons. This program has been very successful since its beginning in May 1987.*

Inc. What is A.A.?

Alcoholics Anonymous is an international fellowship of men and women who have had a drinking problem. It is nonprofessional, self-supporting, nondenominational, multiracial, apolitical, and available almost everywhere. There are no age or education requirements. Membership is open to anyone who wants to do something about his or her drinking problem.

What does A.A. do?

- > A.A. members share their experience with anyone seeking help with a drinking problem; they give person-to-person service or "sponsorship" to the alcoholic coming to A.A. from any source.*
- > The A.A. program, set forth in our Twelve Steps, offers the alcoholic a way to develop a satisfying life without alcohol.*
- > This program is discussed at A.A. group meetings:
-Open speaker meetings: open to alcoholics and non-alcoholics.
(Attendance at an open A.A. meeting is the best way to learn what A.A. is, what it does, and what it does not do). At speaker meetings, A.A. members tell their stories. They describe their experiences with alcohol, how they came to A.A., and how their lives have changed as a result of A.A.*

-Open discussion meetings: one member speaks briefly about his or her drinking experience, and then leads a discussion on A.A. recovery or any drinking-related problem anyone brings up. (Closed meetings are for A.A. members or anyone who may have a drinking problem.)

– Closed discussion meetings: conducted just as open discussion are, but for alcoholics or prospective A.A.s only.

– Step meeting: usually closed, discussion of one of the Twelve

Steps. A.A. members also take meetings into correctional and treatment facilities.

A.A. members may be asked to conduct the informational meetings about A.A. as part of A.S.A.P. (Alcohol Safety Action Project) and D. WI. (Driving While Intoxicated) programs. The meetings about A.A. are not regular A.A. group meetings

Members From Court Programs And Treatment Facilities

In the last year, A.A. groups have welcomed many new members from court programs and treatment facilities. Some have come to A.A. voluntarily; others, under a degree of

pressure. In our pamphlet "How A.A. Members Cooperate" the following appears:

We cannot discriminate against any prospective A.A. member, even if he or she comes to us under pressure from a court, an employer, or any other agency.

Although the strength of our program lies from the voluntary nature of membership in A.A., many of us first attended meetings because we were forced to, either by someone else or by inner discomfort. But continual exposure to A.A. educated us to the true nature of the illness... Who made the referral to A.A. is not what A.A. is interested of in. It is the problem drinker who is our concern. We cannot predict who will recover, nor have we the authority to decide how recovery should be sought by any other alcoholic.

What A.A. Does Not Do

A.A. does not:

- *Furnish initial motivation for alcoholics to recover*
- *Solicit members*
- *Engage in or sponsor research*
- *Keep attendance records or case histories*
- *Join "councils" of social agencies*
- *Follow up or try to control its members*
- *Make medical or psychological diagnoses or prognoses*
- *Provide drying-out or nursing services, hospitalization, drugs, or any medical or psychiatric treatment*
- *Offer religious services*
- *Engage in education about alcohol*
- *Provide housing, food, clothing, jobs, money, or any other welfare or social services*
- *Provide domestic or vocational counseling*
- *Accept any money for its services, or any contributions from non-A.A. sources.*
- *Provide letters of reference to parole boards, lawyers, court officials, social agencies, employers, etc.*

Additional funding sources, such as public contributions in support of the H.E.A. T programs are also developed and implemented to the extent of available funds to meet additional emergency energy assistance needs.*

General Assistance: *Approximately one fourth of Georgia's counties use local funds to provide General Assistance to varying degrees. In some counties this may simply be the provision of canned food, while others may make monthly financial payments comparable to those of the AFDC Program. General Assistance is usually provided for the emergency needs and on-going money payments are restricted to those individuals not eligible for federally funded programs.*

Eligibility requirements and type and amount of assistance are determined by the individual counties funding the program.

The patient must experience physical difficulty obtaining services on an outpatient basis. Service to those with no nursing home bed available. Eligible if service is needed and if living in named counties. Eligibility also depends on home support structure.*

Immunizations: *Immunizations, according to the schedule recommended by the State Department, are given in the health department on a regular basis to anyone requesting this service. DP7', Polio, Rubella, Mumps and Measles are required for entering the first year of school of Georgia.*

Maternal Health Services: *Maternal clinics with a clinician in attendance are held in some of*

the health departments. These women are examined and seen until delivery which are the responsibility of each women. In counties where there are no clinicians to hold a maternal clinic, the nurses hold WIC clinics for pregnant and lactating women who have a nutritional need for supplemental food. Nutritional counseling and physical assessments are a part of this service. Prenatals are encouraged to seek early prenatal care from their private physician.

Public Health Education Services: *Health Education presentations are available to schools, churches and community groups upon request.*

Tuberculosis Program: *Public Health Nurses and Health Program Representatives cooperate in providing services for this program. Diagnosis and Evaluation services in Multi-County Clinics. General Assistance: Approximately one fourth of Georgia's counties use local funds to provide General Assistance to varying degrees. In some counties this may simply be the provision of canned food, while others may make monthly financial payments comparable to those of the AFDC Program. General Assistance is usually provided for the emergency needs and on-going money payments are restricted to those individuals not eligible for federally funded programs. Eligibility requirements and type and amount of assistance are determined by the individual counties funding the program.

Family Planning: *Complete physical assessment which includes blood pressure, weight, height, urine check, hemocrit, RPR, gonorrhea culture, and pap smear. These tests are done after a health history is obtained. Colposcopy clinic for follow-up on abnormal pap smears. Family planning is done on a sliding scale fee schedule ranging from 0 to \$49.00.*

Home Care Services: *They offer nursing care which is part time. Also, they offer speech therapy, physical therapy, and aide services. Client must be under the care of a physician who orders the services and provides supervision. The patient must experience physical difficulty obtaining services on an outpatient basis. Program emphasis is on prevention, early intervention and developmental programs for infants and pre-school children with emphasis on work for adult clients. Priority is given to pre-schoolers and adults as most school aged children are being serviced in Special Education Classes in public school. A wide range of support and professional services are also provided. Facility-based services are provided Monday through Friday, twelve months a year with daily transportation and lunches provided.

The Service Center also offers a variety of services to the area's adult mentally retarded population. These services consist of Specialized Employment Programs which offer work training, recreation/leisure training and training in functional living skills. Training occurs in the facility, in consumer's homes and in community settings. Work activity is centered around work contracts such as recycling, assembling, packaging, collating, prime manufacturing and service contracts. The program's focus is on evaluation of work potential, work adjustment, skill training, and vocational counseling to vocational age adults. Consumers are paid for the work they produce during work activity.

The community integrated services offered by the Service Center provides out of facility training, case management and support services. These services facilitate client transition to and maintenance in other community services that provide opportunities for social integrations such as independent living situations and job placements. Services include resource development and mobilizing of groups, resources and organizations in response to clients needs. Case management services are offered in an effort to link clients to needed services and monitor and follow up in their progress in these services.
